

Dermal Filler Pre-Treatment Instructions

- The most common complications following dermal fillers include: swelling, bruising, tenderness at the injection site, these typically lessen or disappear within a day or two. Some bruising may last up to 10-14 days. Please plan on the possibility of having a bruise and make sure you do not have any major events for 2 weeks after your injections. If this may be a conflict with your upcoming schedule, please notify our office so we can adjust your scheduled appointment accordingly.
- Please arrive at the office without make-up. This is a medical procedure and make-up can increase the risk of complications. If you are wearing make-up the day of the procedure you will be asked to fully remove your make-up. We ask you to not wear make-up for the remainder of the day post injection.
- 3. Photos will be taken prior to any procedure as well as at follow-up. In order to have accurate photos you will be asked to take off any jewelry, remove all make-up, take off your shoes and secure your hair. We will also ask you to rinse your mouth with an antiseptic wash
- 4. Avoid taking Aspirin, Non-steroidal Anti-Inflammatory Drugs (NSAIDS) such as ibuprofen, Vitamin E, fish oil, Ginger, Ginkgo Bilboa, Ginseng, and Garlic 10-14 days prior to the procedure. These drugs and herbs may cause excessive bleeding or bruising.
- 5. If you have a history of cold sores, an active herpes outbreak, or any dental procedures scheduled in the next month please notify us so we can discuss your options.
- 6. To further decrease the risk of bruising you may start Arnica Forte® supplements. The suggested dosing is to take one pill twice daily starting one day prior to your procedure and continue for 3-5 days following the procedure depending on the amount of bruising post procedure. We highly recommend the use of Alastin INhance® which can be applied directly to the injection areas and any bruises 4x daily to decrease the duration of your bruise.

What to expect with dermal fillers

- Numbing medicine will be used to reduce the discomfort of the injection
- The treatment area is cleansed with an antiseptic
- The filler is administered by injecting into the wrinkle or fold
- Multiple injections might be made depending on the depth of the wrinkle and its location
- Following each injection, the correction site will be massaged to conform to the contour of the surrounding tissues
- Ice will be applied during and after the injection.
- After the treatment additional implantation of hyaluronic acid may be necessary to achieve the desired result
- Periodic touch-up injections help sustain the desired level of correction
- The procedure is temporary. Additional treatments will be required periodically for the effects to continue. Generally, the effects last 6 months to one year, some newer filler may last up to 2 years.
